"I DON'T STUDY ENGLISH / YOU DON'T STUDY ENGLISH / WE DON'T STUDY ENGLISH / THEY DON'T STUDY ENGLISH"

HE / SHE / IT + DOESN'T + VERB

"HE DOESN'T STUDY ENGLISH / SHE DOESN'T STUDY ENGLISH / IT DOESN'T STUDY ENGLISH"



DO + I / YOU / WE / YOU / THEY + VERB:

"DO I STUDY ENGLISH? / DO YOU STUDY ENGLISH? / DO WE STUDY ENGLISH? / DO THEY STUDY ENGLISH?"

DOES + HE / SHE / IT + VERB

"DOES HE STUDY ENGLISH? / DOES SHE STUDY ENGLISH? / DOES IT STUDY ENGLISH?"



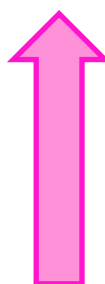
ADVERBS OF FREQUENCY
